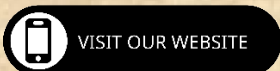

19. PROHIBITED ITEMS

For security and safety reasons, the following items are **NOT ALLOWED** on campus:

- a. Hard drugs such as Marijuana, Cocaine, Heroin, etc.
- b. Cigarettes, including e-cigarettes, vaping accessories, Shisha, etc
- c. Prescription drugs such as Tramadol, Rraphenol drugs with Codeine and any other controlled substance
- d. Lethal weapons and injections
- e. Guns and bullets
- f. Bangers (Knockouts, fireworks and explosives)
- g. Diabolic materials

- h. Alcoholic beverages and drinks
- i. Cooking utensils such as hot plates, rice cookers, toasters, microwaves, electric boiling rings, saucepans, blenders, grillers, ovens, Kerosene lamps, gas lamps, candles, Refrigerators
- j. TV sets, Video machines, tapes, DVD & Amp, VCD players, TV card, antennas
- k. Computer games (Play Station, X-boxes)
- l. Pornographic materials
- m. Condoms and contraceptives
- n. Dumbbells or any other Gym equipment
- o. Washing machines
- p. Smart watch
- q. Faded and tattered jeans, chinos and corduroy
- r. Metallic hangers or any material packaged in glass Bottles
- s. Adaptors/15Amps/2pin plug electronic gadgets
- t. Loudspeaker

STUDENTS' KITCHEN USE RULES & POLICY



UNIVERSITY ON THE NIGER **STUDENTS' KITCHEN USE RULES & POLICY**

The Student Kitchen is provided to promote healthy living, self-reliance, and responsible cooking among students. All users must comply with these rules to ensure safety, cleanliness, and fairness in the use of the facility

1. **ELIGIBILITY FOR USE**

- Cooking is Optional

2. **APPROVED HOURS OF USE**

- The kitchen will be open daily from **12pm to 8:30pm**
- No student is allowed in the kitchen outside approved hours except with special authorization.

3. **CLEANLINESS & HYGIENE**

- Users must clean all utensils, appliances, and work surfaces immediately after use.
- All food waste must be properly disposed of in the designated bins.
- Personal cooking utensils must be clearly labeled and stored appropriately in the hands of the kitchen warden.
- Cooking oil spills or food droppings must be cleaned immediately to prevent hazards.

4. **PROHIBITED CONDUCT & ITEMS**

- The use of **prohibited electrical appliances** (e.g., hot plates, deep fryers, or unauthorized cookers) is strictly forbidden.
- Only cooking gas cylinders with top burners will be allowed.
- Use of Lighter and lighter gun is prohibited.
- Smoking, alcohol consumption, and use of prohibited substances in the kitchen are not allowed.
- Open flames or gas stoves are to be used only in designated cooking areas under supervision if applicable.

5. **SAFETY REQUIREMENTS**

- Users must turn off all burners after use.
- Do not leave food unattended while cooking.
- Report any malfunctioning equipment or safety hazards to the kitchen supervisor or hostel warden immediately.
- Avoid overcrowding in the kitchen; only a reasonable number of students may cook at the same time as determined by the school.

6. **ACCOUNTABILITY & DISCIPLINE**

- Any student found causing damage to kitchen property will bear the full cost of repairs or replacement.
- Repeated violations of these rules will result in withdrawal of kitchen access and may attract disciplinary action in accordance with school regulations.
- Sanction for cooking in the hostel one semester suspension or a fine of N 200,000.00

NB: *This policy will be enforced by the Students Affairs Department. Compliance is mandatory for all approved users.*

DRESS CODE FOR ALL FEMALE STUDENTS

1. During regular lectures, public lectures, special ceremonies, Matriculation, Open Day, Convocation, and examinations, all female students must be corporately dressed. To be corporately dressed connotes a smart skirt, suit, skirt and blouse, or a smart dress with a pair of covered shoes.
2. All dress and skirt hems must be **AT LEAST 4-6 INCHES BELOW THE KNEES**.
3. Female students may wear corporate "native" attire or foreign wear (decently sowed) outside Lecture and Examination Halls, provided it is decently worn.
4. The wearing of sleeveless native attire or baby sleeves and spaghetti straps without a jacket is strictly prohibited in the lecture rooms and in the University environment.
5. Shirt, when worn with a waist coat or armless sweater must be properly tucked into the skirt or loose trousers. It should never be left flying under the waist coat/armless sweater. The waist coat/armless sweater must at least rest on the hip. "Bust coats", terminating just below the bust line, are not corporate; hence they are not allowed. However, Shirts with frills are allowed.

6. Jersey material tops, having cotton collars are not allowed for normal lectures, public lectures, special ceremonies, Matriculation, Convocation, Open Day and examinations. They are regarded as casual wear. Shirts could be tucked into skirts or not. they must, however, be smart, even if they did not tuck in.
7. Skirt could be straight, flared or pleated. Skirts with uneven edges are not allowed. **PENCIL SKIRTS ARE ALSO NOT ALLOWED.** Lacy skirts are better worn to church. None should be tight or body hugging.
8. The wearing of dropping shawls or scarves over dresses or dresses with very tiny singlet-like straps (spaghetti straps) is strictly prohibited in the Lecture and Examination Halls and in the University environment.
9. The wearing of strapless blouses or short blouses that do not cover the hip line is strictly prohibited in the Lecture and Examination Halls and in the University environment.
10. The wearing of over-cling clothing, including body hugs, hip stand trousers and any clothing made from stretchy, elastic material, is strictly prohibited in the Lecture and Examination Halls and in the University environment.
11. The wearing of revealing blouses, especially low-cut blouses and the type of blouse that does not cover the navel, is strictly prohibited in the Lecture and Examination Halls and in the University environment.
12. The wearing of ordinary transparent dresses is strictly prohibited in the Lecture Rooms and in the University environment. Transparent dresses may be worn with **DARK** singlet or other forms of **DARK** inner wear.
13. The use of face-caps in the Lecture Rooms, Examination Halls, University Chapel and in the University, environment is strictly prohibited.
14. Wearing slippers and half-shoes is not allowed in college buildings, Library, Cyber Cafe and Chapel from 7am-6pm.
15. Female students are advised to wear corporate hairstyles that are moderate and neat, that characterize a decent and joyful, University student. In addition, use of hand dryer should be restricted to the hairdressing salon.
16. **Coloured hair, coloured attachments** and/or the **use of two or more shades of coloured attachments** are strictly prohibited in the University.
17. Female students may wear trouser suits; however, the jacket must fall below the hipline.
18. Earrings and necklaces may be used by female students, provided they are not the bogus and dropping types. **The wearing of more than one earring in each ear is strictly prohibited anywhere in the University.**
19. Wearing ankle chains and rings on toes is prohibited in the University community.
20. The possession and/or wearing of Jeans or any jeans like materials of any kind for example Chinos, Corduroy and Alanshi is strictly prohibited in the University environment.
21. Female students can wear low sandals or covered corporate shoes.
22. Tennis shoes or sneakers may only be worn outside the Lecture and Examination Halls.
23. Piercing of any part of the body, other than the ear (for earrings), is strictly prohibited **Any piercing done before Admission into the University shall be declared during the first Registration in the first year.** Failure to do so will attract requisite penalty.
24. Tattooing of any part of the body is prohibited. **Any Tattoo done before Admission**

into the University shall be declared during the first Registration in the first year. Failure to comply will attract appropriate sanctions.

25. Skirts must be worn with slips underneath. Also, skirts slits should not be unnecessarily long and should not expose the knees or any other part of the body that ought to be covered.
26. Wearing Stiletto & bogus shoes as well as clothing and jewelry that do not conform to the prescribed dress code is strictly prohibited in the University environment will be confiscated.
27. The wearing of $\frac{3}{4}$ (three quarters) trousers of any kind to the Lecture Halls, Chapel Services or during official hours is strictly prohibited. Farmer's shorts are prohibited. They can only be worn around the Students' Residential Area. Farmers' shorts are outrightly prohibited.
28. Wearing boob tubes and camisoles under jackets should be done properly. The entire body must be covered. No part of the chest should be revealed.
29. Wearing of tops, shorts or T-Shirts with unholy inscriptions such as SEX, BITCH and other form of indecent words is not allowed anywhere in University on the Niger.



DRESS CODE FOR ALL MALE STUDENTS

All male students are expected to dress corporately to the Lecture Halls, Examination Hall and special ceremonies, such as Matriculation, Open Day, Convocation, public lectures, Church Services, and other events specifically so stated.

To be corporately dressed connotes a shirt and necktie, a pair of trousers, with or without a jacket, and a pair of covered shoes.

1. For national days such as Independence Day, national dressing code may be observed. Any shirt with unholy inscriptions or any sign with hidden meaning is strictly outlawed as it would be confiscated.



CHAPEL REGULATIONS

- Attendance at all Chapel activities is mandatory for all the students. The Chapel activities include, Daily Morning Devotion, Mid-week Holy Communion Services every Wednesday, Sunday Services, and other special programs to be fixed or directed by the Chaplaincy.
- All students shall attend Chapel activities with relevant worship materials, to wit; Daily Fresh Manna Booklet, Bible, Hymn Book and writing materials
- Lateness to Chapel activities is strictly prohibited. Punctuality is the watchword.
- Indecent dressing to Chapel activities is strictly prohibited and default attracts severe sanctions/penalty.

- e. All Students shall sign the attendance register at the end of every church service. Default attracts severe sanctions/penalty.
- f. Students are not permitted to worship outside the campus.
- g. Students are encouraged to identify and fully participate in any of the campus fellowships, as clearance letter from these fellowships is a sine-qua-non for final clearance from the Chapel at the time of graduation.
- h. Exit Permit must be obtained from the school authority and a copy thereof made available to the Chaplaincy.
- i. Students loitering about the compound during church services, or along the walkways, is strictly prohibited.
- j. Students are to obey and comply with the chapel authorities' directives as well as that of the ushers, especially during church services.

RULES AND REGULATIONS ON SECURITY.

- a. Every vehicular as well as material movement, in and out of the campus, shall undergo a security check at the security post/checkpoint.
- b. All visitors are expected to park their vehicles at the Primary School field and students on the other hand shall meet their supposed visitors at the said Primary School Field for any discussion or meeting. No visitor is allowed into the school building/premises, hostels, and staff quarters for any reason. Default attracts severe penalties and sanctions.
- c. No vehicle is allowed to be parked on the school premises beyond two days without the express permission of the security personnel. Appropriate security measures shall be met with any defaulter.
- d. All security personnel shall obey every directive, whether written or oral, issued by the superior officers and school management.
- e. Students should observe and be guided by the barriers, walkways and signages in the campus.
- f. Security patrols by the personnel is to be more frequent, both in the daytime and night- time.
- g. All security personnel must be on their uniform while on duty.
- h. All students must observe the daily light-out by 9pm. Any other activities by any student beyond 9pm should be private and quietly done without any disturbance to the peace and tranquility of other students.

- i. Shouting, exchange of words or altercation, quarrelling, fighting, playing loud music in hostels and in the compound, is not only tolerated but strictly prohibited within the institution.
- j. Mingling and loitering the campus with the opposite sex at odd hours and places is not only tolerated, but also strictly prohibited. On no account should male students be seen at the female students' hostel, let alone sleeping thereat, this also applies to female students' vice-versa.
- k. Protests, riots or any other form of public disturbance is strictly prohibited. Any grievances, be it personal or public, should be channeled to the appropriate authorities within the school for redress.
- l. Any form of cooking in the hostels is also strictly prohibited.
- m. During holidays, students will vacate hostels. However, if for any reason a student intends to stay back during holidays, he/she must obtain express permission from both the school authorities and Chaplaincy. The student is also expected to abide by the rules and regulations of the school community.

CHAPEL DRESS CODE/RULES

- a. Any form of indecent dressing is not only tolerated, but also strictly prohibited within the campus environment.
- b. Bizarre and coloured hairstyles, both for male and female students, is strictly prohibited.
- c. Female students' skirts shall be at the knee level. Spaghetti strap dressing, show-back, any form transparent clothes exposing the nakedness of any student is not only tolerated but strictly prohibited.
- d. Male students are not to sag their wears or put on any rugged clothes that portrays or smacks irresponsibility.
- e. Wearing of trousers by female students within the campus environment is strictly prohibited.
- f. Wearing of bum-shorts by female students within the campus environment is strictly prohibited.
- g. Wearing waist chain/beads, leg chains/beads, fixing eye lashes, piercing and fixing nose rings, tongue rings, or wearing double earrings, are strictly prohibited and attracts severe sanctions. Male students should not pierce or put on earrings.
- h. Students should compulsorily put on their **Identity Card during school hours, Examination hours** and whenever they want to cross the University gate.

REGULATIONS ON SOCIAL ACTIVITIES.

- a. Any form of secular, and ungodly music/songs is not allowed within the campus environment.
- b. Any form of social activities within the campus environment ends by 6.00pm.
- c. Activities in all social events within the school environment must be properly scrutinized by the Dean Students Affairs before its presentation to the students for participation.
- d. Also, indecent dressing of any kind is not allowed in all social activities in the school environment.

REGULATIONS ON WASTE MANAGEMENT.

- a. Students shall provide waste bins and disposal of nylon bags in their classes and hostels for disposal of waste at the approved waste dumps within the school compound.
- b. Students should endeavor to drop waste at the strategic waste bins in the school compound and should not litter the environment with waste droppings. Serious sanctions await defaulters.
- c. Students/departments shall embark on a periodic clean-up exercise within and around them different blocks and departments, as cleanliness is everybody's business.

NB; Serious and different categories of sanctions await defaulting student(s) according to the discretion of the Chaplaincy and the University Management.
